

MICHAEL ENGLAND



Michael England has established a reputation as a highly versatile conductor of an extremely wide repertory, including musical theatre. classical. ballet. film and live television. He has conducted many top UK orchestras including the Philharmonia, CBSO, Royal Scottish National, Royal Philharmonic Concert, BBC Concert, BBC Philharmonic, Royal Northern Sinfonia, Royal Liverpool Philharmonic, and others. International engagements include the Shanghai Opera House Orchestra, Shanghai Philharmonic, Bangkok Symphony Orchestra, Slovenia Radio Symphony, Stockholm Sinfonietta, the Estonian Glasperlenspiel Sinfonietta and NDR Radio Philharmonie. He made his ballet debut with Shanghai Ballet, conducting their new production of Hamlet, choreographed by Derek Deane, for which he created the score, adapting and orchestrating music by Tchaikovsky. Michael has returned there to conduct revivals of Hamlet, as well as productions of Romeo & Juliet, The Sleeping Beauty and The Lady of the Camellias. This year sees debuts with Queensland Ballet and the London Philharmonic and next year he conducts for the first time at Tulsa Ballet and at Gothenburg Opera.

Singer, broadcaster and author Gary Williams has been described as "a true song stylist" by London What's On and "the UK's leading standard bearer for the supercool era" by the London Evening Standard. The star of the West End's "Rat Pack" has performed everywhere from Bestival to Buckingham Palace. He's a favourite with big bands and concert orchestras throughout the world, from the BBC Concert Orchestra to the Melbourne Symphony. Other work includes performing for The Prince of Wales at Buckingham Palace, a tribute to the MGM musicals with the John Wilson Orchestra at the Royal Festival Hall, performing at Sinatra's Palm Springs home for the LA Jazz Institute, 'Winter Wonderland' at the Royal Albert Hall, 'A Swingin' Session' with the Nelson Riddle Orchestra in Los Angeles, Gloria Hunniford's 'Open House' (with Donny Osmond and Burt Bacharach), the soundtrack for the Warner Bros' motion picture Mrs. Ratcliffe's Revolution and BBC1's Doctor Who Christmas Special.

Louise Dearman trained at Laine Theatre Arts, Highlights of her theatre work include Ruth Sherwood in Wonderful Town for Opera Holland Park, Sarah Parker in Mimma for Cadogan Hall, Daisy in Side Show for Southwark Playhouse, Adelaide in Guys and Dolls (UK tour), Elphaba in Wicked at the Apollo Victoria Theatre, Glinda in Wicked, also at the Apollo Victoria Theatre and Mrs D in the world premiere of The Waterbabies (Leicester Curve Theatre). She has also performed as Eva Peron in Evita (UK tour), Grizabella in Cats (Cyprus), Debbie in Debbie Does Dallas (Edinburgh Festival), Mimi in Guys and Dolls (Piccadilly Theatre), Sarah Brown in Guys and Dolls (UK tour), Jan in Grease (Victoria Palace Theatre and UK tour) and Narrator in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (UK tour). As a soloist, Louise has performed with, among others, the BBC Concert Orchestra, the London Concert Orchestra, the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the John Wilson Orchestra, the Hallé, and more.


